- **Lower Goulburn and District Fishing Guide**

Fishing for the elusive Murray cod is the highlight of the Lower Goulburn district. There are many access points to the Lower Goulburn River through State Forest and National Parks.

- **Broken and District Fishing Guide**

Anglers to this region are able to enjoy many small, picturesque locations to undertake a spot of fishing. Murray cod and Golden Perch are the primary species to target.

- **Goulburn and Broken River Access Map**

The Goulburn River is one of four Heritage Rivers in Victoria. The Broken River flows into the Goulburn in the heart of Shepparton. Their floodplains and swamps between Shepparton and Mooroopna have great cultural significance and are integral to maintaining the rivers' health and supporting our community.

- **Waranga Basin Recreation Guide**

Waranga Basin is the fourth largest inland waterway in Victoria. The Basin was formed on the site of a natural wetland (Waranga or Gunn's Swamp) which was located on Waranga Creek.

# FISHING LICENCES

## DO I NEED A LICENCE?

A Recreational Fishing Licence (RFL) is required when taking, or attempting to take, any species of fish by any method including line fishing, bait collection, gathering shellfish, yabby fishing, prawning and spear fishing.

## WHO IS EXEMPT?

You will not need a licence to fish if you are under 18 years of age or 70 years of age or over.

### Or a holder of a:

- Victorian Seniors Card or interstate equivalent
- Veterans' Affairs Pensioner Card
- Veterans' Affairs Repatriation Health Card coded (TPI)
- Commonwealth Pensioner Concession Card coded either DSP, DSP Blind, AGE, AGE Blind or CAR.
- A person that identifies as Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander

## WHERE CAN I PURCHASE A LICENCE?

Victorian anglers have the option to buy 3 year, 1 year, 28 day or 3 day Recreational Fishing Licences.
